


Carbon monoxide (also known as CO) is a dangerous gas which has no colour or smell.

If you breathe a lot of it in, it can make you very ill.

CO can be found in your home, and comes from things like cookers, boilers and chimneys that aren't working properly.



All gas flames in your home should be blue, not orange

It's important to make sure the appliances in your home, such as cookers and boilers, are checked by a gas engineer every year.

Signs of CO poisoning










How to keep you and your family safe













If you think you have a CO problem at home:

- Open doors and windows
- Turn off gas appliances such as cookers and leave the house
- See your doctor quickly or go to hospital let them know you think you have CO poisoning. They can check your blood and breathing.
